
You may be required to show your passport or other I.D. when entering the campus through the main gate, and bags will be checked.





## TRANSPORTATION FROM THE BEN-GURION AIRPORT TO JERUSALEM

### Transportation from Ben-Gurion Airport to Jerusalem

You will be arriving at Ben-Gurion Airport, which is located about 40 minutes from Jerusalem. There are several transportation options for arriving in Jerusalem. Please note, the Institute does not cover transportation costs.

1. Private taxis to Jerusalem can be found as you exit the arrivals terminal (on the left-hand side), and cost about \$70 (roughly NIS 273 – the exchange being around: NIS 3.5 for \$1). Make sure you take an authorized Taxi; they are lined-up and take passengers in turn.
2. [Nesher Taxi](#) is a shared door-to-door shuttle service, providing transportation between the airport and Jerusalem. They operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (including Saturdays) and drop off passengers in all neighborhoods. From the airport to Jerusalem, you do not need to reserve in advance; however, from Jerusalem to the airport it is advised to reserve 12-24 hours in advance.

Have your destination address ready to provide them with. When you exit the arrivals hall, turn right, and walk to the end of the platform where you'll find the **Nesher** shuttle station. Price is NIS 64, cash only (approximately \$16). Further information is available at the [Nesher Website](#).

3. Afikim Bus Line 485: This bus line leaves every hour on the hour (24/7) from Ben Gurion Airport to nearby the University. This service costs 16 NIS (\$4.50). Take the bus to the last stop, which is called Museum Boulevard, Eliezer Kaplan. From there, it is about a 7-minute walk to the campus. This is a good option if you are coming directly from the airport to the University, or directly from the University to the airport. Exact bus route and details can be found [here](#).

### PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN JERUSALEM:

It is easy to get around Jerusalem using public transportation. City buses run frequently, and cost 5.90 NIS (ticket may be bought from the driver, in cash). There is also a light rail that runs east-west through the city, and also costs 5.90 NIS per ride. There are many bus stops near the hotel; for some of the most popular bus lines (1,3, 6, 9,15, 66) get off at the “Gesher Hameitarim/Herzl Blvd” stop. The train station closest to the hotel is called “Kiryat Moshe”. Train tickets must be bought beforehand from the kiosk at the station, and can be paid for using cash or credit card. Public transportation does not run on Shabbat (sundown Friday evening until sundown Saturday evening).

Taxis may be hailed on the street, or ordered ahead of time (also in Shabbat). **The Gett taxi** app works well in Jerusalem, or you can call a cab company such as Gilo Taxis: 052-3456702

### **Computer Connections at the IIAS**

Please bring your laptop with you if you wish to use a computer during the Conference for your personal needs. There is free access to wireless internet (WiFi) on campus. The network name is (SSID) “HUJI-guest” (no password is needed).

You can purchase sim cards at the airport, (019 and Steimatzky are both stores you can find after baggage claim), or you can also access sim cards and other prepaid options at any of the cellphone stores and bodegas scattered throughout Jerusalem. You can also purchase a sim card at the University store on campus, at the first building on your right-hand side. [See here](#) for a full comparison of prices. Note, to purchase an Israeli sim card your phone needs to be unlocked.
